- Ethics asks questions about your everyday life and evaluates how we come to know our morality. It encourages you reassess how you go about your everyday life in the world and makes you think on a deeper level of what really is wrong and right. Ethics is involved in every judgement you make and there's no escaping it.
- Christian Thought Explores human nature, the self and the afterlife. Within this we exam sin and grace and the concepts of Christian Ethics. Are Christian Ethics and values the right way to live or are these Ethics now out of date and irrelevant?





