

## Y11 KS4 Curriculum Overview: Health and Social Care

**Rationale:** In year 11, students will use their knowledge from Y9 and Y10 to study and apply the factors that affect health and wellbeing, learning about physiological and lifestyle indicators, and how to design a health and wellbeing improvement plan. Students study and explore practically, health and social care services and how they meet the needs of real service users. They also develop skills in applying care values.
